

# Maternal and Newborn Program Practice Update

## Best Possible Medication History & Medication Reconciliation

<b>What's New?</b>	<p>We are clarifying Best Possible Medication History (BPMH) and Medication Reconciliation (Med Rec) roles and responsibilities in preparation for Accreditation 2023.</p> <p>Pharmanet access via CST Cerner improves the accuracy of BPMH and Med Rec.</p>															
<b>Why?</b>	<p>Accurate BPMH contributes to safe patient care by way of knowing a patient's complete medication history.</p> <p>Med Rec is an Accreditation Canada Require Organizational Practice (ROP), an essential practice that we <b>must</b> have in place for patient safety and risk minimization <b>to pass accreditation</b>.</p> <p>Average data shows that we need to be more consistent with Med Rec on admission, transfers, and discharge:</p> <table border="1" data-bbox="334 751 1451 861"> <thead> <tr> <th>Feb 2023</th> <th>BPMH &lt;24hrs</th> <th>Adm Med Rec &lt; 24hrs</th> <th>Transfer Med Rec – to and from HAU</th> <th>Discharge Med Rec Maternal</th> <th>Discharge Med Rec Infant</th> </tr> </thead> <tbody> <tr> <td></td> <td>85%</td> <td>71%</td> <td>50%</td> <td>77%</td> <td>90%</td> </tr> </tbody> </table>				Feb 2023	BPMH <24hrs	Adm Med Rec < 24hrs	Transfer Med Rec – to and from HAU	Discharge Med Rec Maternal	Discharge Med Rec Infant		85%	71%	50%	77%	90%
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<b>How does this affect my practice?</b>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Nurses</b></p> <p>On <b>admission</b> to hospital (e.g. UCC, IOL), collect a Best Possible Medication History (<b>BPMH</b>) by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Importing External Rx History (from PharmaNet) in the patient's Medication List</li> <li>- Discussing with patient and family <b>all</b> medications they are presently taking (including any non-prescription medications, supplements, etc.)</li> </ul> <p>On <b>discharge</b>, for patients on medications, under '<b>Documentation</b>' look for <b>Patient Discharge Medication List Note</b> (Med list signed by Provider).</p> <p>Right Click - print and give patient 'Discharge Document' - <i>Discharge Medication Instructions</i> which is the patients <b>Medication List</b></p>		<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Providers</b></p> <p>On <b>admission</b>, check the <b>BPMH</b> is correct with the patient / PharmaNet and perform <b>admission med rec</b>.</p> <p>On <b>transfer</b> to/from HAU, <b>reconcile</b> a list of all present medications / orders the patient is taking.</p> <p>On <b>discharge</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Complete <b>Discharge Med Rec</b> by reconciling the patient's medications with the patient:</li> <li>-Complete a <b>Discharge Summary</b> for patients on medications. [Ability to create own template to include appropriate information]. Discharge Summary auto-sent to Community MRP</li> </ul> <p>Discharge Med Rec auto-populates to <b>Patient Discharge Medication List</b> (under Transfer/Discharge).</p> <p>-<b>Sign 'Patient Discharge Medication List Note'</b> for RN to print and give to patient</p>
